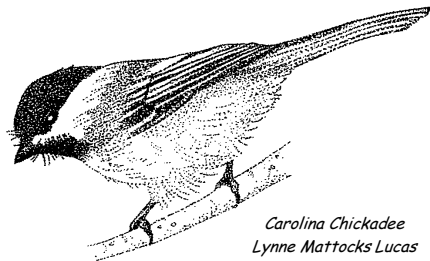


Who Are We?

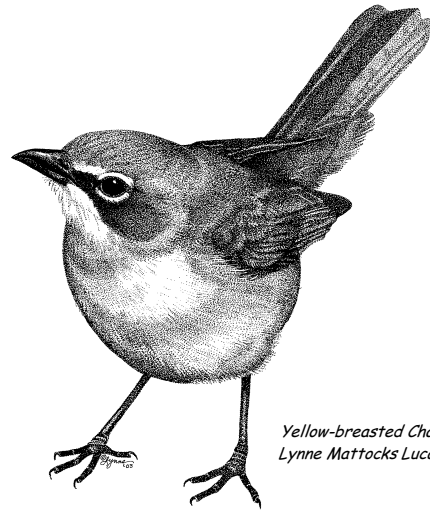

Club Activities

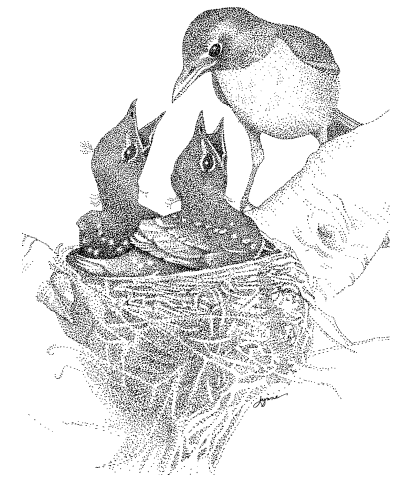

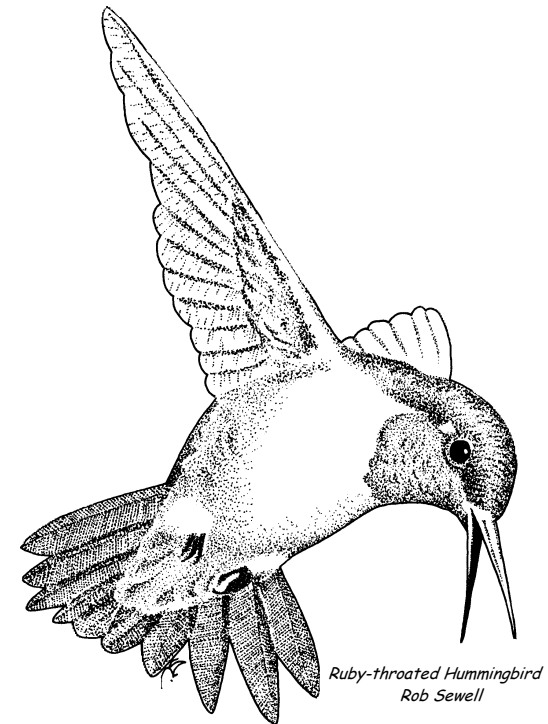
