1993 North American Migration Day Count in North Carolina

The 1993 North American Migration Day Count in North Carolina, held on the second Saturday in May (8 May 1993), resulted in counts being held in eight counties around the state, from the coast to the mountains. These counties (by geographic region, with county seat) were:

In all 172 species and approximately 9,694 individual birds were observed in North Carolina. Total party-hours were 202.25; total party-miles were 781.5; total participants 155.

1993 North American Migration Day Count in South Carolina

The 1993 North American Migration Day Count in South Carolina, held on the second Saturday in May (8 May 1993), resulted in counts being held in eleven counties around the state, from the coast to the mountains. These counties (by geographic region, with county seat) were:

Coastal and Outer Coastal Plain:

Charleston County (Charleston)

Jasper County (Hardeeville)

Inner Coastal Plain:

Hampton County (Hampton)

Piedmont and Inner Coastal Plain (i.e. Fall Line area):

Lexington County (Lexington)

Chester County (Chester)
Fairfield County (Winnsboro)
Newberry County (Newberry)
Spartanburg County (Spartanburg)

York County (York)

Mountains and Piedmont:

In all some 194 species and approximately 36,436 individual birds were observed in South Carolina. Total party-hours were 233.25; total party-miles were 1,192.75; total participants numbered 67. (Note that the five people who counted Fairfield County in the morning moved over the Broad River and counted Newberry County in the afternoon. Counting these five twice gives a total of 72 "county-participants".

Rarities and high counts:

Charleston counters reported a healthy 216 Orchard Orioles, but none of the 145 species were very unusual (unless the unidentified *Empidonax* flycatcher was something other than the expected Acadian).

Chester had a Barn Owl (a long-time and very dependable stake-out) and some 600 Cliff Swallows (indicating just how common this species has become under bridges over Piedmont reservoirs).
