

Fall 2004 North American Migration Count in South Carolina

The Fall 2004 North American Migration Count was held on Saturday, 18 September, and 68 parties of 108 individuals in 13 counties across the state observed 31,080 individual birds of 209 species. Temperatures ranged from 60 to 86°F; cloud cover ranged from none to 40%; winds ranged from 0 to 40 miles per hour; and no rain fell.

Perhaps the most noteworthy sightings came from Greenville County, which documented three species of hummingbirds – the expected Ruby-throated but also Black-chinned and Calliope. Also noteworthy was an inland sighting of Black-necked Stilt at Aiken County's Silver Bluff Audubon Sanctuary. In terms of sheer numbers, no county came close to Jasper, which had tremendous populations of a variety of species.

Birders located 27 of the 35 regularly occurring warblers, the most common of which were Pine Warbler (287), Common Yellowthroat (119), Northern Parula (71), and American Redstart (59). Other notable finds were Nashville Warbler (1), Golden-winged Warbler (1), and Blackpoll Warbler (2).

Birds found in only one county include Northern Shoveler, Ruddy Duck, Horned Grebe, Eared Grebe, American White Pelican, Reddish Egret, Yellow-crowned Night-Heron, Glossy Ibis, Roseate Spoonbill, Peregrine Falcon, King Rail, Virginia Rail, Purple Gallinule, American Coot, American Golden-Plover, American Avocet, Whimbrel, Ruddy Turnstone, White-rumped Sandpiper, Stilt Sandpiper, Buff-breasted Sandpiper, Short-billed Dowitcher, Long-billed Dowitcher, Wilson's Snipe, Wilson's Phalarope, Red-necked Phalarope, Bonaparte's Gull, Least Tern, Black Skimmer, Barn Owl, Black-chinned Hummingbird, Calliope Hummingbird, Red-cockaded Woodpecker, Common Raven, Horned Lark, Purple Martin, Cliff Swallow, Marsh Wren, Gray-cheeked Thrush, Golden-winged Warbler, Orange-crowned Warbler, Nashville Warbler, Black-throated Blue Warbler, Yellow-rumped Warbler, Blackburnian Warbler, Prothonotary Warbler, Wilson's Warbler, Yellow-breasted Chat, Song Sparrow, Swamp Sparrow, White-throated Sparrow, and Purple Finch.

Species reported in every county included Mourning Dove, White-eyed Vireo, Blue Jay, Carolina Chickadee, Tufted Titmouse, Carolina Wren, Northern Mockingbird, Brown Thrasher, American Redstart, and Northern Cardinal.

The top three counties in terms of species were Jasper (124), Aiken (108), and Charleston (96).

Charleston, which earned third place for the day in number of species, was one of only two counties with Least Bittern; had the high counts for Great Egret (78), Little Blue Heron (63), Red-shouldered Hawk (13), Common Moorhen (160), Barred Owl (8), White-eyed Vireo (101), Red-eyed Vireo (40), Brown-headed Nuthatch (56), Blue-gray Gnatcatcher (27), Palm Warbler (5), Eastern Towhee (38), and Savannah Sparrow (3); and had exclusives on Whimbrel, Red-cockaded Woodpecker, and Orchard Oriole.
